A.	CALL TO ORDER Mrs. Lee called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. She welcomed everyone and indicated that she was pleased that everyone was able to attend.	
B.	APPROVAL OF AGENDA One item was added to the agenda under G. New Business, ii) Educational Specifications for Eleanor W. Graham Middle School. By consensus, the agenda was approved as amended.	
C.	APPROVAL OF MINUTES By consensus, the minutes of the March 21, 2005 meeting were approved.	
D.	BUSINESS ARISING FROM MINUTES i) Certificate of Appreciation Mrs. Lee took this opportunity to recognized Towne Ford Sales and Service Ltd. for their pledge of \$20,000 over the next five years to a scholarship fund. Hal Somers accepted the "Certificate of Appreciation" on behalf of the firm.	
E.	INFORMATION ITEM i) Portal for Education Peter Gadd, Technology Mentor, gave a brief presentation on the	

	<p>Department of Education Portal Site. He described the site as a web server based (computer) access to provincial, district and school “filing cabinets”. Users will have access to an increasing number of school, district and provincially based resources. He noted that it is for the use of educators in New Brunswick. He indicated that the site is at various stages of progress, but once it is fully developed users will be able to upload and download files for their own use or to share/collaborate with others. Mrs. Lee thanked Mr. Gadd for a very informative presentation.</p> <p>ii) Smart Board</p> <p>Todd Fitzpatrick, Technology Mentor, gave a presentation on the Smart Board. He explained that the Smart Board is a computer/projector based technology that makes classroom presentations of teaching/learning material very dynamic, interactive and convenient. He indicated that the delivery of multimedia support for learning concepts being developed can be done by either interactive internet sites or direct use of “Notebook” software to deliver prepared lesson material. He noted that in his role, he goes out to the schools to show teachers how to use it. He indicated that this is a great resource that the teachers have at their disposal. He demonstrated to council members how the Smart Board works, and informed them that every school in the district has at least one and many have several. Mrs. Lee thanked Mr. Fitzpatrick for an excellent presentation.</p> <p>Mrs. Baldwin noted that by the end of June, there will be about 125 Smart Boards in District 16 classrooms.</p>

She indicated that Tim Dunn and Esmond Daigle, School District 16; Danial Scully, Principal; Jan Manger, PSSC Chairperson; Kim Beers, DEC; sat on a committee with André Paulin, Department of Education, to look at the educational specifications. She noted that the document has the consensus of the group. After council reviewed the document, IT WAS MOVED BY Winnie Wilson, seconded by Jody Holmes, that the educational specifications for the Eleanor W. Graham Middle School be approved as presented. I.	<p>"Brag" Session</p> <p>Mrs. Baldwin reported that Eddie Pinder was chosen to be an international judge at a Sports Stacking Competition in Colorado.</p> <p>Mrs. Wilson indicated that some students from Bonar Law Memorial School were interviewed for an article in the Times & Transcript. As part of an enrichment project last year, the students researched original Native legends from their community, rewrote and illustrated them, along with some original stories, then published a book. They launched their book at the Northrop Frye Festival last week in Moncton.</p> <p>Mrs. Lee advised that two students from James M. Hill Memorial High School won a video editing competition for the district and will be going to the provincials in Dalhousie.</p> <p>Mr. MacLeod indicated that Harkins Elementary has been putting strategies in place to reduce student absenteeism. He noted that due to their efforts, the absenteeism rate has decreased substantially over the past few years. He felt that they are definitely headed in the right direction.</p> <p>Mrs. Baldwin provided information on the summer camp to Beijing and Shenzhen, China. She noted that Bonar Law Memorial School is using the funds they made by hosting Chinese students to send a student to China. She noted that this is a wonderful cultural experience.</p> <p>Mrs. Baldwin advised that the Turnaround Achievement Awards are scheduled for June 2.</p> <p>Mrs. Baldwin informed council of the retirement dinner for Devota Appleby to take place on June 9 at the Miramichi Golf & Country Club.
