	AGENDA ITEMS
Α.	CALL TO ORDER
	Mr. Petersen called the meeting of the District Education Council to order at 5:31 p.m. This was a virtual meeting that was live-streamed to the public. Mr. Petersen began the meeting by acknowledging the land on which the District Education Council was meeting is located on traditional unceded and unsurrendered territory. This territory is covered by the Treaties of Peace and Friendship, which the Mi'kmaq peoples first signed with the British Crown in 1725. The treaties did not deal with the surrender of lands and resources but, in fact, recognized Mi'kmaq title and established the rules for what was to be an ongoing relationship between nations.

	IT WAS MOVED BY Gilbert Cyr and seconded by Paul Mourant that the agenda be approved. MOTION CARRIED.
C.	PRESENTATION Mr. Daniel Doucet, Principal Parkwood Heights Elementary School
	Mr. Doucet gave a short presentation about Parkwood Heights Elementary School. He spoke about the increase in enrollments and class sizes. Mr. Doucet shared photos of the schools' sensory path, student Zen Den and Suite Retreat, which are different areas students can use to decompress and regroup.
	Mr. Doucet was pleased to announce that after-school activities are back, running from 3-4 pm, a couple days a week. Currently these activities are mainly sports,

	Ms. Carmel Hambrook asked Mr. Doucet why the activities were only sports. Mr. Doucet indicated that our district Phys. Ed. Lead, Mae Cameron, has been making the efforts to implement these programs. Intentions are to bring other activities, like music and art programs back, as they existed before the Covid pandemic.
D.	PRESENTATION Ms. Melanie Cortes, Regional Director Early Childhood Education
	Ms. Cortes gave a presentation on the Canada Wide- N.B. Childcare Agreement. The Federal Government has invested \$30 billion between 2021-2026, then another \$8 billion to maintain the changes that will be implemented. For New Brunswick, this means approximately \$500 million to improve quality, affordability, accessibility and improve inclusion processes for early childhood care and learning. Ms. Cortes discussed the two action plans developed to help disperse this funding over the 5 years.
	NB has committed to reducing the cost of childcare by the end of 2022. Create an average cost of \$10/day average for childcare by the end of 2026, focus on high quality, affordable, accessible services, address barriers that exist around inclusion, flexible hours, and infant spaces.
	Ms. Cortes spoke about the progress thus far. This included addressing the wage gap between the early childhood care sector and the education sector. Changes and goals to improve accessibility, the designation of facilities and improvements to create new spaces. Ms. Cortes also spoke to the proposed changes to education, programs for high school students and ongoing learning for childhood educators.
	At the end of her presentation, Ms. Cortes responded to questions from council members. Ms. McBain, Mr. Petersen, and the other members thanked Ms. Cortes for her informative presentation.

	 Nancy McBain attended the Canadian School Board Association meeting in Fredericton with Chairperson, Mr. Petersen.
	 Ms. McBain attended the Mi'kmaq flag raising ceremony at Dalhousie Regional High School. Ms. McBain was impressed and pleased with the school's efforts for inclusion, community support, and the support from students.
	• Ms. McBain attended a meeting for Jordan's Principle. Ms. McBain said discussions of the meeting centered around discrepancies in services, hiring and the approach being used. She would like to know at what level real decisions are made and how this can be improved.
	 Ms. McBain inquired about a policy for smudging in schools. She indicated that there appears to be a need for a policy for this type of activity, so it does not become restricted. There is also a need to bring more Mi'kmaq speaking Elders into the schools. She would like to know if we can reschedule a meeting that was previously cancelled to address these items.

	 Mr. Cyr attended a PSSC meeting at Sugarloaf Senior High School. The message he is receiving from parents is of deep concern for the future of the new school, the future of French Immersion, the mental health and wellbeing of students and teachers, and the future of the DEC and PSSCs. Parents are also concerned about the recruitment of volunteers and revival of afterschool programs.

Sheila Rogers

- Ms. Rogers attended the Janeville Elementary PSSC on Oct. 24th. The school sponsored the cross-country race for grades 3-5. The school has an upcoming Christmas concert in December. All staff are getting trained in First Aid, and the principal wanted to say that the staff are visibly fatigued at the end of the workday.
- The PSSC meeting for Terry Fox Elementary School was held on Oct. 25th, which Ms. Rogers also attended. TFES is a pilot school working on their Healthy School Certification. They have a program with a school in Ukraine in partnership with AEI, as well.
