Anglophone North School District is pleased to welcome students from around the world to study in our schools.

Before you apply:
☐ The street where you live will determine the school you will go to.
☐ Parents can not choose the school their children will attend. The final decision about where
your child
will go to school is made by Anglophone North School District.
☐ It takes 7 – 14 days to process an application.
☐ Students will be placed in an English classroom at the grade level that corresponds to their
age.
Types of International Students: A) K-12 Student Study Visa
☐ All study visa students are required to pay tuition.
☐ Tuition fees change in June for the following school year. Please contact the Anglophone
North
School District to ask about the tuition fee (Derek.Hutchison@nbed.nb.ca).
\square K-12 students who will live in Canada without their parents must have a legal guardian in
Canada.
Proof of legal guardianship is required.
☐ Proof of age, proof of student visa, and proof of immunization and medical insurance are required.
B) Permanent Residents
☐ Permanent resident students do not pay tuition.
☐ K-12 students who will live in Canada without their parents must have a legal guardian in
Canada.
Proof of legal guardian is required.
☐ Proof of age, proof of permanent residency and proof of immunization and medical
insurance are
required.
C) Parents with a Study Visa for University
\Box All K-12 students whose parents are also students at university do not pay tuition while their
parents are studying at university.
□ Proof of age, proof of parent's study visa and proof of immunization and medical insurance
are required.

How to Apply:

1. Apply Early. It takes many weeks for CANADIAN CITIZENSHIP AND IMMIGRATION to prepare your

Student Study Visa. You cannot get a Student Study Visa until you have an "Official Letter of Acceptance" from Anglophone North School District.

2. You must have an address in Anglophone North School District for your child to go to school. You

can send your application while you look for a home. Anglophone North School District will send

you a "Conditional Letter of Acceptance".

- 3. We do not accept applications by e-mail. Applications must be signed.
- 4. Parents, legal guardians or brokers can apply to Anglophone North School District. Anglophone

North School District staff will talk to, or mail information to, one contact person for each student.

- 5. Download and complete the application form on this website
- 6. If you need a Student Study Visa send all these things by mail:
 - o Signed application form
 - o Photocopy of student passport (proof of age)
 - O Photocopy of immunization records and medical insurance
 - o Photocopy of student records (report card)
 - o Photocopy of legal guardian agreement (if necessary)
 - O Bank draft or cheque for tuition fee in Canadian dollars

If you are a permanent resident send all these things by mail or fax (506-684-7552):

- o Signed application form
- o Photocopy of student passport (proof of age)
- o Photocopy of permanent resident card and landing paper
- o Photocopy of immunization records and medical insurance
- o Photocopy of student records (report card)
- O Photocopy of legal guardian agreement (if necessary)

You will get a fax, e-mail or letter from Anglophone North School District to confirm we received your application.

- 7. After 7-14 days, Student Study Visa applicants will receive an "Official Letter of Enrollment" if all the required documents are received and the applicant has a Canadian address. Otherwise, a "Conditional Letter of Acceptance" will be sent to you explaining what you must do next.
- 8. After 7-14 days, permanent resident applicants will receive an "Official Letter of Enrollment" if all the required documents are received. Otherwise, a "Conditional Letter of Enrollment" will be sent to you explaining what you must do next.

Coming to Canada

- 1. Before arriving in New Brunswick, please contact our School District Office to tell us you are coming and make an appointment so we can welcome you and help you register for school.
- 2. Bring all your original documents to your appointment. We will complete registration at your appointment.
- o Passport
- o Immunization
- o Proof of medical insurance
- O Letters from Anglophone North School District
- o Student Study Visa
- o Permanent resident card
- o Your local address and telephone number
- O An interpreter if necessary
- 3. You can visit your new school.

Refund Policy

- 1. Full or partial refunds will be made under the following conditions:
- o If Canadian Immigration does not approve the student visa (Students may apply in writing for a refund. Immigration documents must be attached).
- 2. If the student returns to their home country or your visa changes (e.g. you become a permanent resident), you may get a pro-rated refund. International students have many new things to learn about their new home and school. Making new friends and speaking a new language can be difficult. If required, we can provide English Second Language tutoring support for your child. Parents and teachers should remember that a student's school performance may be temporarily affected by so many changes in their lives.
