The Convention on the Rights of the Child: 25 years already!

The <u>Convention</u> on the Rights of the Child recognizes and protects, in 54 articles, the civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights of the child.

It applies to all children and youth under 18 years. Have a look at the <u>Child friendly</u> <u>language version of the *Convention*.</u>

Equal, protected and participating

A guiding principle is a principle which plays a role in the implementation of all articles of the Convention. Make them known! The four guiding principles of the <u>Convention</u> are the following :

- Non-discrimination (Article 2): the *Convention* protects all children regardless of their gender, language, culture, disability or other discrimination;
- Respect for the best interests of the child (Article 3): children must be protected and all decisions concerning them ought to respect their welfare;
- The right to life, survival and development (Article 6): to guarantee the right to live their childhood and to grow up in the best conditions.
- The right of children to give their opinion (Article 12): the right to participate in decisions that affect them taking into account their age and maturity;
